"The LEADER'S EDGE" by drmichaelbell

The SARS-CoV-2 pandemic was more than a public health crisis; it was a watershed moment for the Church. Sanctuaries were shuttered and faithful routines were upended. For many congregations, the return to in-person worship still hasn't resulted in a return to pre-pandemic worship attendance levels, fiscal stability and/or ministry participation. Truth is, in most churches membership is down. Volunteers are overextended. Giving is inconsistent. The lingering question many church leaders now face is: What does faithful leadership look like in a church that's been thinned out, burned out and is facing further decline?

The post-COVID church is not the same as the pre-COVID church. Many pastors are facing empty pews and working overtime to encourage maxed out core teams. Lay leaders who once anchored ministries have stepped away. Some members have shifted to online-only engagement, while others have ghosted altogether.


This ongoing reality has strung out both clergy and laity. Pastors feel overwhelmed and are, moretimes-than-not, under-resourced. Laity have yet to adjust to the challenges of a church that is still finding its footing. Yet, this tension isn't the end of the story. It's an opportunity to reimagine the Church, not as it was, but as it can be.

You, as a church leader, want your church to grow **but before regrowth comes reset.** Churches need to hit the reset button and revisit foundational questions, such as, "Why do we exist?" What better time than now to clarify your mission, your purpose, not your programs or traditions. Clarify what truly matters now. The church must streamline its focus by cutting what no longer aligns with its purpose.

Leaders, you may remember what the talk was almost immediately after the novel coronavirus was downgraded. Back then, churches worked overtime trying to locate pre-pandemic attendees who didn't want to be found or bothered. Instead, your local body of Christ as is should take shared ownership of what comes next.

Here are a few practical, Spirit-led steps for churches that want to become healthy, not just bloated in size:


 Empower shared leadership.
Pastors can't (and shouldn't want to) lead alone. Pastor, equip, trust and release lay



leaders. Make the shift from a pastor-centered model to one of discipleship-driven delegation. Offer training, affirm gifts and let people lead even *if it* means doing things differently.

- Cultivate authentic community. People aren't looking for performance; they're yearning for connection. Follow up. Reach out. Rebuild the relational web of the church, one conversation at a time.
- Prioritize spiritual formation, which is a core part of the discipleship process. Equip the congregation to grow in faith outside the walls of the church house.
- Get caught up in serving your community. The pandemic reminded us: the Church is not a building. Re-engage the local mission field. A church that blesses its community earns the right to be heard.
- Leverage technology with intentionality. By now you know that online ministry isn't a fad; it's a new frontier. Rethink how you use social media, livestreams and digital platforms. Don't just limit technology to online Sunday worship services. Create digital spaces for prayer, conversation and engagement.
- Celebrate small wins. Keep your church or ministry in the loop on what is working. Highlight baptisms, service projects, restored relationships or answered prayers. Joy builds momentum.
- Practice pastoral and congregational care. Grief, loss, and anxiety still hover over many households. Normalize lament. Offer counseling, prayer partners or healing services.

"A Life of Freedom"

"If the Son therefore shall make you free, ye shall be free indeed." (John 8:36)

The word "freedom" in the dictionary is defined as the condition of not being in prison or captivity. It is also the condition of being free from restraints without the control or interference of another.

Freedom is what our nation claimed on July 4, 1776 since breaking away from British rule, committing to freedom and self-governance. Freedom is what Nelson Mandela claimed after a 27-year prison term that restricted him from the outside world. After his release, he committed to ending apartheid and bringing hope of freedom to the South African nation.

Freedom is never free. There is a price that must be paid. By the sin of one man (the First Adam), sin was spread unto all of mankind (Romans 5:12). We were stripped of original righteousness and condemned to death. We became slaves to sin and were held captive by its darkness with no hope. Freedom is what Jesus (the Second Adam) established for all of mankind who were enslaved to the grips of sin and the penalty of death. 



National Baptist Convention USA, the nation's largest Black denomination, is under fire for accepting \$300K from Target during national boycott

The National Baptist Convention USA (NBCUSA) is facing criticism for forming a new partner-

ship and accepting \$300,000 from Target during a national boycott of the giant retailer.

Journalist and commentator, Roland Martin, lambasted the partnership and called on member churches of the NBCUSA to speak up

The National Baptist Convention is the largest predominantly Black denomination in the nation, with approximately 31,000 churches and 7.5 million members, according to stats released by the organization.

The national boycott of Target came in response to the Minnesota retailer's rollback of its Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DFI) initiatives.

The boycott began to gain traction when Pastor Jamal Bryant of New Birth Missionary Baptist Church launched #TargetFast, a national call to abstain from patronizing Target for 40-day.

While the official 40-day "fast" has ended, many protesters and proponents of DEI have continued the boycott as an means to apply sustained pressure on Target. Since the boycott, Target has reported a

Critics argue that NBCUSA's partnership with Target undermines the DEI cause and the push for meaningful accountability. Moreover, they assert that \$300K is a pittance for Target who made \$4B in 2024.

The NBCUSA's partnership with Target is to continue for only 3-years.


While the NBCUSA never officially endorsed #TargetFast or the national boycott, many of its churches and members participated in and even championed the Dr. Kimber's announcement further explained, "Target's generous donation will help us to provide scholarships, support senior citizens, and invest in entrepreneurship programs that uplift our people

Dr. Kimber has yet to respond to the criticism leveled by Roland Martin and others.

We're also proud to share that New Mount Rose is now officially a film-friendly campus-a sacred space where creativity, culture, and Christ-centered community thrive together.






