"The LEADER'S EDGE" by dr. michael bell We've heard all of the quotes about the advantages of TEAMWORK,

haven't we? There's "Teamwork is the secret that makes common people achieve uncommon results." Then, some anonymous somebody quipped, "Teamwork divides the task and multiples success." But, my favorite Teamwork quote is by internationally respected leadership expert and Teaching Pastor John Maxwell who said, "Teamwork makes the dream work, but a vision becomes a nightmare when the leader has a big dream and a bad team." This is especially true in the context of the local Church.

Senior pastor, ministry associate, deacon, ministry coordinator, Sunday School teacher, or committee chairperson, no matter how great an individual player you are, your relationship with your leadership team can make you or break you. But, more importantly, if there is little or no synergy, clear communication, and commonly-embraced purpose among Church leaders, it can wreak havoc in the congregation and undermine the Church's mission.

I just read an online article with a great title: "Why The Church Needs Teamwork, Not Indepen-dent Cowboys." Isn't that an awesome title? The author, Jamie Rohrbaugh, writes, "The Church is no place for independent cowbovs. What's an independent cowboy? An independent cowboy is someone who likes (or tries) to operate on their own, without help, without covering, without using other people's gifts. A cowboy, in a negative sense, is someone who pays no attention to protocol or to raising up other people. A cowboy likes to make the show all about himself or herself. A cowboy thrives in the spot-<u>light, and wants to keep it on himself</u> as much as possible. An independent cowboy treats the church like his or her own personal thrill ride, trying to do whatever they like without accountability."

How many Churches have been ruined, rundown and, literally, disbanded because of "independent cowboys?" How many Church splits are the result of a "bad team" or an "independent




cowboy/cowgirl?" Haven't you heard of Church leaders who treated the Church like it was theirs? Apparently, they haven't read Matthew 16:18, where Jesus says, "on this rock I will build MY Church!" Rohrbaugh says, If you are a Christian, you are part of the Body of Christ. 'Part' is the key word there. Neither you nor I are the whole body; we are only a part, and we need one another."

Teamwork is Biblical and critical. Every local Church described in the New Testament had a plurality of mature persons serving together as a leadership team. As, a pastor, I've had the privilege of appointing several leadership teams. Frankly, some of my most memorable moments have been related to working some outstanding team of leaders. The growth and goals we were able to achieve couldn't have been accomplished without clergy and laity working together toward shared objectives. But as great as it is to serve with a team of men and women who love God, some of my most frustrating moments in life have come from attempting to lead a team that was peopled with too many independent cowboys and cowgirls. My least favorite times in ministry have occurred when I've had to deal with leadership teams made up of people who were committed to doing their own thing and not functioning as a team.

Let's pick this subject up in next month's issue. We'll talk about how to build a COHESIVE Church leadership TEAM!

The Life of A Faith Race

"Don't you realize that in a race everyone runs, but only one person gets the prize? So run to win!" (1 Cor. 9:24)

In the life of faith, every believer must travel the course known as the Faith Race. Like an athlete, it is a race that requires discipline, to help build and strengthen, and training to help guide and mature. An athlete must condition his body to handle potential blows and challenges. As believers, we condition our faith by renewing our minds in the Word of God so that we may be able to stand against the tricks and blows of the enemy. An athlete must stay focused and not deviate despite opposition and resistance. As believers, we must set our focus on the One who is in control of the race despite the critics who advocate for us to fail. The Father is always for us and never against us. (Rom 8:21)

An athlete places a restriction on certain liberties so that he can be at his optimum strength to remain in the race. This can involve diet, activity, or even

friendships. In the Faith Race, a true disciple restricts his diet through a consistent regimen of fasting so as to stay spiritually in tune with the Father. Sabotaging relationships that stand as obstacles in the race must be severed. Overindulging in excessive activities must be recognized for they can weaken your strength and drain you from important factors in the race such as family and worship (private and corporate).

Every athlete needs proper training to help build and perfect his craft. In this Faith Race, you need a trainer, someone who can help push, develop and promote you. God places anointed leaders, mentors, and spiritual counselors in our pathway to help us see the race more clearly than we can and not fail. Therefore, we should not despise discipline or training especially when it is to help make us better for the Kingdom. (Heb. 12:5)

The purpose of all the sacrifice, discipline and training is to achieve the ultimate goal-the win. For the athlete, it is to obtain a temporal crown. For the believer, it is to obtain an incorruptible crown. There is no race unless there are runners. In this



Faith Race, we should desire to share this journey with other believers. We may not all run at the same pace, but we are all called to run and win. As you become more astute as a Faith Racer, encourage and build someone else to join the race as well. In this, we all become winners for we are doing what our Father has commanded that we do and that is to build up one another in our most holy faith. (Jude 20) That's Kingdom. So dear hearts, remain committed and determined to stay in the Faith Race.

Seeing God in The Chaos

Chaos. Calamity. Confusion. And Christianity. No, not "religion", Christianity - receiving Christ as Savior, then making every effort toward living a life that is pleasing to Him. The common denominator among chaos, calamity, and confusion is that all of them surely and eventually find their way into our lives as Christians. The Word of God tells us. "many are the afflictions of the righteous, but the Lord delivers him out of them all" (Psalm 34:19). Job goes on to tell us that, in paraphrase. man born of a woman is of a few days, and those are full of trouble (Job 14:1). Jesus said, "In the world you will have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world" (John 16:33).

So, as believers we know chaos is going to invade our lives, both on a personal and a ministerial level at some point. But the wonderful thing about God is that He is well able to operate in the midst of chaos. When it seems dark, the light of Christ will reveal itself in such beautiful ways. When Joseph's brothers sold him into slavery, they thought they were rid of him; but God had other plans. He was already preparing the way for Joseph. The Bible says that in all this chaos, God was with Joseph (Genesis 39:2, 21). He went from family-driven betrayal, to being sold to a band of Ishmaelites, to running Potiphar's house, to prison, to interpreting dreams for his fellow prisoners and for Pharaoh, and finally to being elevated as the No. 2 man in Pharaoh's administration. Joseph found favor while a slave, and then as a prisoner. Even his slavemaster, Potiphar, knew the Lord was with Joseph (Genesis 39:3).

Near the end of Mark Chapter 4, the boat

that Jesus and his disciples were in began to fill with water because of a great windstorm. Fearing for their lives the disciples

hurriedly wake up a sleeping Jesus and say in essence, "Teacher, we're about to die! Don't you care?" Jesus spoke to the sea, saying, "Peace, be still!" And at that point the wind stopped and the waters were calm again (Mark 4:35-41). The disciples saw chaos, but Jesus saw calm.

Are you facing what seems to be a chaotic situation? Does God seem distant? Please let me encourage you. God sees vou, and He is more than able to act in vour behalf. I invite vou to meditate on Ephesians 3:20: "Now unto Him who is able to do exceedingly abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that works in us,..." Not long ago I wanted to give up, but God was keeping me. He had not left me, and He hasn't left you either. Now is the time to stand on the Word of God like you've never stood before! Believe that God really IS your Deliverer. When you believe that, you will begin to think, speak, and act in faith.

Local Women's Organization Gifts Dolls By Janine L Palmore

"Something to admire, nurture and emulate." This is what dolls mean to girls of all ages, including some women.

As young girls, dolls teach us responsibility as it is something we have to take care of. Dolls are faithful companions that tag along wherever

they are carried off to. They can be sounding boards that girls talk to. Dolls are usually beautiful and human-looking, serving as a mirror to a girl's being. Girls like pretty things and often mimic the beauty they see in dolls. In fact, 'Doll' is often used as a term of endearment to compliment cuteness or beauty.

But what if dolls that looked like you were scarcely accessible? It might make you question your own beauty and importance in the world. This is one of the many reasons Quinnie Nichols, Founder of the Queenish Women's Professional Club (QWPC) decided to start giving away dolls of color to African American girls of all ages.

Quinnie says, "Brown girls are underrepresented and misrepresented." To remedy this, part of her mission became putting black and brown dolls in the hands and lives of African American girls. Quinnie also points out the importance of dolls in a woman's life and how we continue to gravitate to them even in adulthood. As collectors of dolls and other items they continue to encapsulate the image and beauty of a Queenish woman.

Earlier this month, Quinnie and the ladies of QWPC went to Beltline Elementary School in Lancaster, Texas, and gave away approximately 37 dolls and books. Quinnie and the organization choose random dates and locations, at least quarterly to meet up and give away brown dolls and books.

To commemorate Black History Month, Quinnie added books about African Americans to give away along with the dolls. This way children would not only see a positive image, but also be able to read about great contributors who look like them. Quinnie agrees that reading is fundamental to learning and development and added books as a way to reinforce the importance of education. It's not just about vanity, Quinnie wants to help the whole person by including books to enrich the minds of children and give them a greater sense of pride about who they are and who they can be.

This is the QWPC's third year giving away dolls. "I keep dolls in the trunk of my car so that if I see a girl, I can give her a doll," Quinnie said. QWPC gives away a variety of black dolls which display positive images. They give away dolls in professional career attire, church lady attire with big hats, dolls that look like beautiful queens. They choose dolls that represent the strength, dignity and integrity of African American women. The QWPC could pop up at a mall near you to give away dolls as Quinnie hopes to increase their outreach efforts.

While the organization does not solicit donations of black dolls and books, they are open to receiving them so that they can maintain an healthy inventory in case of a spontaneous give-away opportunity. 

The Gospel Corner with Proclaimer of the Word... Rev. J.R. Brumfield

A Hope Beyond Death Matthew 28:1-8

I. INTRODUCTION

The cornerstone of the Christian faith is the Resurrection. There are several biblical passages that provide support for the Resurrection. The best known of the Resurrection prophecies is the one penned by Israel's King David in Psalm 16:10. This Psalm was written a thousand years before the birth of Jesus. It states; "For you will not abandon my soul to the grave; nor will You allow Your Holy One to undergo decay. Our Lord and Savior did not see decay in the grave because He arose before decay could take place. We have a hope beyond death. In Acts 13:33-35, Paul referred to Psalms 16:10 when he spoke to the Jewish community in Antioch. The Apostle Paul declared that God had raised the Lord Jesus from the dead in fulfillment of the Old Testament scripture. The Old Testament is the New Testament concealed and the New Testament is the Old Testament revealed. Jesus fulfilled the Holy Scriptures. In Matthew 5:17-20, Jesus stated on one occasion that he did not come to destrov the law or the prophets but to fulfill it.

The Resurrection of the Lord Jesus is strongly implied in another Psalm of David. In Psalms 22: 19-21, the suffering Savior prays for deliverance "from the lion's mouth" (a metaphor for Satan). Our Lord Jesus praved in the Garden of Gethsemane. He prayed until he had sweat great drops of blood. Nevertheless, in Matthew 26:39, He said "let thy will be done". The prayer at Gethsemane is then followed immediately in verses 22-24 by a hymn of praise in which the Lord Jesus thanks God for hearing His prayer and delivering Him. The Resurrection of the Lord Jesus is clearly implied between the ending of the prayer in verse 21 and the beginning of the praise song in verse 22. The champion of our salvation was prophesied as being victorious. The **Resurrection of Jesus Christ dominates** the theme of the New Testament.

The Resurrection is the divine vindication of the cross. When one looks at the cross, one sees the guilt of the world laid upon the sinless Savior. There is great pain and labor at the cross. When a woman is pregnant with child, there are some labor pains. However, when the birth of the child occurs, all pain seems worthwhile due to the delivery of the baby. When Christ died on the cross, it looked like all hope was lost. The earth shook and the bible declares that it became extremely dark over the earth. Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ died on Good Friday. When Christ arose on the third day, the earth shook again with exaltation. Our Lord Jesus delivered on the Old Testament prophesies. He arose! Isaiah prophesied that Jesus would arise from the dead and He did. It is because of the Resurrection that we as believers have a hope beyond the grave. We might be down today but we will rise from the difficulties of this life. As believers, we will rise one day to a body that is incorruptible. We will have a glorious body similar to our Lord Jesus Christ. It is better to suffer for a season and to reign with Christ one day. Life is but a season to a child of the King. When this life is over. I want

to see Jesus!

As we approach our text, we will find that the Lord keeps His Word. In John 2:19, Jesus said that I will destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up. Let's see how the Lord worked it out for our salvation.

The Women's Motivation; v. 1-2

In these verses, we see that Mary Magdalene and the other Mary came to see the sepulcher. These were the same women that attended the funeral of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ in Mark 15:43-47. These women had previously witnessed the crucifixion of Jesus Christ. Nevertheless, these women still wanted to come to the burial site and express their love and final respects to the deceased body of Christ. They were still inquiring after Him. If we continue to seek Christ during our dark moments in life, we will surely find Him to be a resting place.

No mention is made of the Virgin Mary being with Mary Magdalene and the other Mary at the burial site. These women did not only intend to follow Christ at the cross but they also ventured into the cemetery. As Christ in the grave was beloved of the saints, so the saints in the grave are beloved of Christ. Neither death nor the grave can slacken that bond of love which is between them.

The other gospel writers say that the women came to anoint the body at the tomb. However, Matthew states that they came to see the sepulcher. These women went to show their good-will in another visit to the dear remains of their beloved Master. In Mark 16:3. the women had a question regarding who would roll the stone away. In Mark 16:4. we find that the stone had been rolled away. In Matthew 28:2, we find that there was an earthquake and an angel came to roll away the stone. This signified the legal discharge of the prisoner. Jesus paid the price and the Lord God had accepted the payment for our

II. The Angel's Message, v.3-6

The angel of the Lord descended from heaven. The angels frequently attended our Lord Jesus. They were there at his birth and in his temptation. The angels were there in Christ's agony. However, we find no angel attending him at the cross. When His Father forsook Him. the angels withdrew from Him. However, in this passage we find that the angel came and rolled back the stone and sat upon it. Our Lord Jesus could have rolled back the stone himself by His own power, but he chose to have it done by an angel. The incorporation of the angel for this task reveals to us that proper satisfaction has been made for

our sins. Our sins were imputed to Him. Being under arrest pursuant to that imputation, Jesus did not break out from prison. Our Lord had a fair and legal discharge which He obtained from heaven.

Being delivered for our offences, he was raised again for our justification. He died to pay our debt, and rose again to proclaim our liberty. Divine justice was satisfied and an angel was commissioned to roll back the stone. Please understand that the angel did not raise Him from the dead but acted as a parole officer. The debt of sin had been paid in full by the Lord Jesus. Heaven consented to the release of our Lord. The angel's sitting upon the stone expresses a secure triumph over all the obstructions of Christ's resurrection. The angel sat defving all the powers of hell to roll the stone to the grave again. Christ erects his seat of rest and seat of judgment upon the opposition of his enemies.

The angel sat with expectation of giving the women an account of the Lord Jesus resurrection. The angel's countenance was like lightning, and his raiment white as snow. The whiteness of his raiment was an emblem not only of purity, but of joy and triumph. When Christ died, the court of heaven went into keep mourning, signified by the darkening of the sun. However, when Christ arose, heaven put on the garments of praise? Are you ready to praise the Lord for what He has already done?

In verse 4, we find that the soldiers were struck with terror of the sight of the angel. In verse 5 the angel said unto the women, "Fear not." The angel told the women that the Lord Jesus had risen from the dead. This is the good news of the gospel. The resurrection of Christ is the joy of His friends and the terror and confusion of His enemies.

III. The Angel's Mandate, v.7-8

In verse 7, the angel directs the women to go and carry the tidings of the Resurrection to Christ's disciples. It is probable that the women wanted to entertain themselves with the sight of the sepulcher and the discourse with the angels. It was good to be here, but they have other work appointed them. They must go tell the disciples. The Disciples of Christ must first be told the news. It was a dismal time with the disciples. They were between grief and fear. It would be good news for such a dismal time in the life of the disciples to hear that Jesus is raised from the dead. In closing, make sure that you share the gospel with someone else. Jesus has risen from the dead and He is alive forever more. There is hope beyond death!




